Students call talk uplifting; showed type of success is real

Students and teachers alike raved about a recent motivational speaker came to Jena High School.

"He is quite possibly the best I've ever heard," Principal Slick Joiner said about Hollis Conway, one of America's all-time best high jump-

Conway spoke to students a few weeks ago about the importance of dreaming big and the principles that allowed him to achieve his greatest dream. The Jena Giant Alumni Association paid for the speaker to address the school.

Hollis Conway has been one of the world's most dominating athletes. He has numerous awards and set many records. His 1991 jump of 7'10.5" still stands as the American Indoor Record some 17 years later.

He is a faithful husband, father and an ordained minister. He is also the president of Overcoming Obstacles, Inc., a non-profit motivational speaking com-pany. Hollis has authored two books: YES I CAN and GRASSHOPPER.

Born in Chicago, Illinois, Hollis is the baby of seven

children. His mom and dad separated which caused them to move quite frequently. At the age of two, their family moved to Detroit, Michigan and at age nine, they moved to Shreveport, Louisiana. With so much instability at home, Hollis quickly found solace in the athletic arena.

He tried basketball and football but it was in the high jump that Hollis found his mark. While not being able to clear 5'6" as a freshman, he was just a junior varsity jumper. However, his remaining years in high school saw him go from that J.V. jumper to one of the best high jumpers in the United States.

He eventually went on to have a 16-year career and he is going down as one of the best high jumpers in all of

In his book, YES I CAN, Hollis relates his dream early in his life:


"As a young kid, I grew up with a lot of obstacles in my life. I was undersized, financially destitute highly unpopular. Basically, was skinny, broke and I didn't have a girlfriend.

much going for me at all, but I did. I had a dream. I had a dream of one day representing my country in the Olympics. I wanted to stand on the awards stand, in my patriotic red, white and blue uniform and pridefully watch as they put the official Olympic medal around my neck.
"I wanted to see the

American Flag being raised and I wanted to hear our National Anthem being played for the entire world to hear. It was a beautiful dream that permeated my every thought.

"Nine years later my dream became a reality as I stood on the Olympic platform in Seoul, Korea, with my red, white and blue USA uniform on. I received a silver medal around my neck and I saw our flag raised to a place for the entire world to
